Joined by pedestrian linkages, these two areas will be the heart of the celebration and equally accessible.

Local, national, and international talent will be showcased on the **LIVE CITY** stages day and night. Each site will also offer visitor support services such as information and merchandise as well as food and beverage sales.

When it's time to change from Olympic to Paralympic mode, the excitement of both sites will merge onto one at the former Bus Depot with a full slate of stage entertainment and screen-based events.



Vancouver will host the best experience for residents and visitors alike with world-class coverage and entertainment – accessible to all.

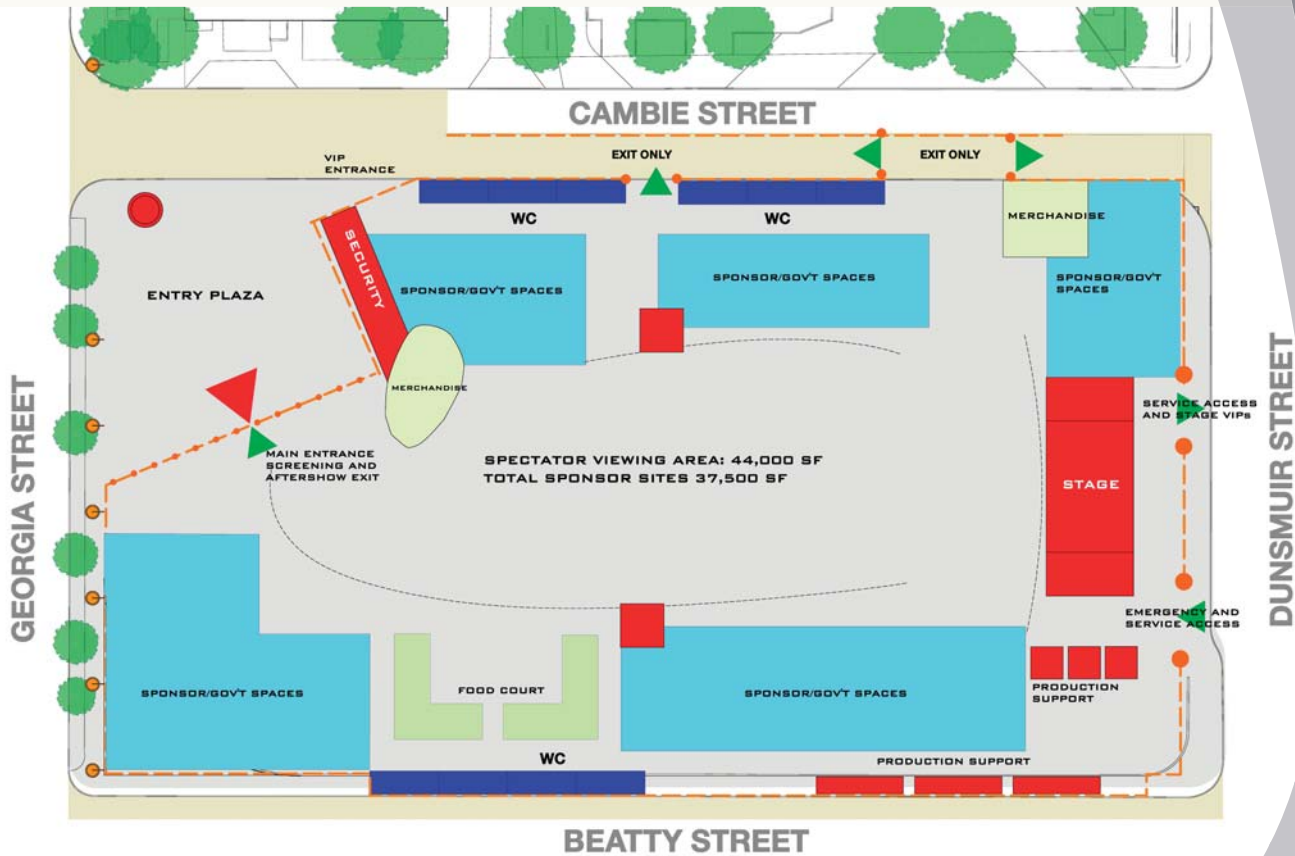
Vancouver 2010 Olympic and Paralympic

**GEORGIA STREET SITE (THE FORMER BUS DEPOT SITE)
 PRELIMINARY LIVE SITE PLAN**

The former Bus Depot, with 11,800 square metres of space will host stage and screen programming.

This location, in the heart of downtown Vancouver and next to the Stadium Skytrain station, is bordered by Dunsmuir Street to the north, West Georgia Street to the south, Cambie Street to the west, and Beatty Street to the east. It is adjacent to the Queen Elizabeth Theatre complex, one of the primary sites for the Olympic and Paralympic Arts Festival, and is minutes away from both BC Place Stadium and GM Place (the Olympic hockey venue). The site will be clearly visible from Georgia, Dunsmuir, Beatty, and Hamilton Streets and to the spectators leaving GM Place and BC Place.

DAVID LAM PRELIMINARY LIVE SITE PLAN

For **LIVE CITY**, David Lam Park offers over 18,580 square metres to host those who crave a celebration.

Situated along the waters of False Creek and adjacent to Vancouver's trendy Yaletown district and the Yaletown Canada Line station, this location is bordered on the north by Pacific Boulevard, on the south by False Creek, the east by Drake Street and west by Homer Street. Just a few minutes from BC Place Stadium, this site will host stage and screen programming, a unique water feature, water-side stage, and a nightly closing show. The location, site of the Vancouver International Jazz Festival, will be clearly visible from Pacific Boulevard, the Cambie Street Bridge and Davie Street.
